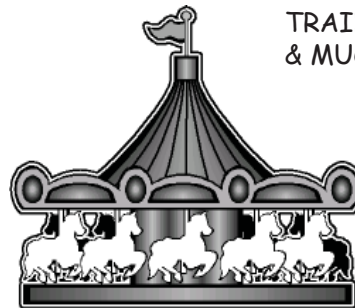

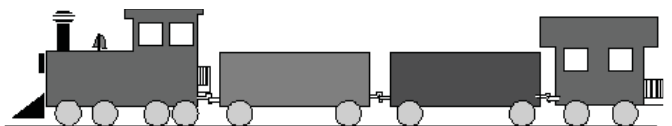

Professor Alan M. Dershowitz has been called "the nation's most peripatetic civil liberties lawyer" and one of its "most distinguished defenders of individual rights," "the best-known criminal lawyer in the world," "the top lawyer of last resort," "America's most public Jewish defender" and "Israel's single most visible defender." The Felix Frankfurter Professor of Law at Harvard Law School, Prof. Dershowitz firmly believes that his Jewish values compel him to affirm liberal social values.

Dennis Prager is a widely-heard and respected conservative radio talk show host, columnist, author, ethicist and public speaker. Author of numerous books on Judaism, anti-Semitism and the impact of secularism on American Jews, Prager is a public figure who does not shirk from controversy, but believes that his Jewish values compel him to speak up in support of conservative positions on major social issues facing America and the world today.
